How to enter:

1. Who can enter:

The competition is free to enter and open to young people between 11 and 16 years old living or attending a place of education, youth provision or youth services in the Borough of Waltham Forest.

2. Email your entry only

- Please email your poem(s) or short stories as an attachment only (eg Word or .txt document) and include your name on each poem or short-story.
- In your main email please include your name, age, contact mobile number, email address and your postal address. You can use the address of your school, youth provision or service instead of your postal address as long as you are known and can be contacted at that postal address in Waltham Forest.
- Email your entry to wayne@forestradio.co.uk
- Entries will not be accepted by post
- Include your full name on each entry

3. Sorry we can't accept:

- Any previously published poems or short-stories
- More than two items (poems, short-stories or one of each) per entrant
- Poems exceeding 25 lines in length.
- Short-Stories exceeding 1,500 words in length.
- Any entries arriving after the closing date (7th January 2018 at 12 midnight)
- Any correspondence once a decision has been taken
